RE Growth Program & Advanced Metering Functionality (AMF)



Your Performance-Based Incentive (PBI) is staying exactly the same.

As Rhode Island Energy continues implementing Advanced Metering Functionality (AMF), we want to address a key concern we've heard from our RE Growth solar participants: Will my monthly incentive change? The answer is simple: it will not.

When you enrolled in the Renewable Energy Growth (RE Growth) Program, you locked in a fixed rate for the energy your solar system generates. That rate—shown on your Certificate of Eligibility—is guaranteed for the full term of your agreement (15 or 20 years depending on your system). It does not change with the AMF transition.

So what is changing?

The utility is rolling out advanced meters across Rhode Island to improve how energy use is tracked and managed. These meters provide greater control, choice and convenience in managing energy consumption with online access to detailed daily usage. But that's it—they're just better tools for reading your system's output and usage. They don't change how your incentive is calculated, how it's paid, or the rate you're paid.

How your PBI works (and still will)

- Each month, you will receive a PBI at your fixed contract rate for all energy generated.
- A portion of your PBI is applied to your bill as a bill credit to offset charges for energy the home uses.
- After the bill credit allocation, remaining PBI (if any) is paid monthly as a residual cash payment.

Summary

Nothing about AMF affects your PBI. You're still getting paid the same way, at the same rate, and for the same term you agreed to when you enrolled.
